Year 4





There is no doubt that the discoveries of Ancient Greeks still affect the world today - even in the UK.

Throughout this Learning Exploration, we will explore the origins of democracy and the arts as well as discussing the discoveries of some 'Great Greek Thinkers'. We will evaluate the impact of these Great Greek ideas and consider the influence they have had on modern society. This is important to consider in terms of democracy, as democracy is rooted in Ancient Greek society.

As we delve into the concept of democracy, children will have opportunities to experience what voting would have been like in Ancient Greece and compare this to systems which exist today. By delving into this fascinating civilization, children will develop curiosity, critical thinking, and an appreciation for many modern technologies.

Hook into learning:

The Ancient Greeks had some great thinkers whose work is still used in society today. The origins of pneumatics can be traced back to the first century when ancient Greek mathematician Hero of Alexandria wrote about his inventions. This discovery paved the way for future pneumatic systems to be developed. To hook in our children, we will discuss this 'Great Greek Thinker' and what pneumatics are before spending the day creating our own pneumatic monsters.
