The following subjects will be taught discretely during this half term:

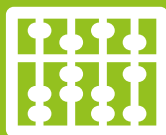
- Maths

Children will continue to work on their individualised targets based on the outcomes in their EHCPs, termly SEND plans and any reports from outside agencies.

Maths

Children will explore:

- Multiplication and Division
- Fractions
- Time
- Place value to 100



Writing

We will continue to support the children accessing the Nest to develop their independent writing skills, supporting them to confidently use the grapheme phoneme correspondences to form their words more independently.

Our texts will include:

- Fiction - *Sylvia and Bird* by Catherine Raynor
- Non Fiction - Non chronological report – *Reptiles* by Angela Royston
