Key achievements to date: July 2022

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

Kev Indicator 1

All children engage in regular physical activity:

- All YR 6 pupils taking part in the daily mile
- 2hrs of PE timetables for all year groups weekly
- Development of active lunchtimes.
- The school continued to promote active travel to school and signed up to take part in the Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel 2022 between 21st March and 1st April 2022. Newport registered 2304 active journeys to school during the 2 week period.

Kev Indicator 2

All pupils have access to high-quality PE teaching as part of the drive to raise standards. 1.2 FTE specialist teacher's employed to deliver at least 1 PE lesson each week.

Full engagement with LA & local CPD offer.

Kev Indicator 3

Staff have access to training and support to increase confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and Sport.

PE Subject Leader attends LA and Local CPD.

PE subject leader expertise used to support staff as needed.

Kev Indicator 4

As reduction in Covid restrictions allowed a broader range of activities has been offered:

- 337 (79%) children took part in at least one sports festival this year. This includes:
 - o 59 Year 1 children attending a multi-sport festival
 - o 59 Year 2 children attending a tennis festival
 - o 54 Year 3 children attending in a multi-sport festival
 - o 54 Year 4 children attending a cross-country festival
 - o 58 Year 5 children attending a cross-country festival
 - o 53 Year 6 children attending a cross-country festival

- o 48 children (31 Y6 & 17 Y5) completed Level 2 Bikeability Course
- o 20 children from Year 5 took part in a Dance Festival at Park School. This was a new festival and helped to promote dance and engage some harder to reach children in sport and physical activity.
- o All children in Year 5 & 6 received a coaching session from James Kemp, North Devon Club and Community Cricket Coach, as part of a Cricket Coaching Engagement Day on 16th May 2022
- o 11 Year 6 more-able children took part in the 'Rising Stars' programme, which included a tennis/gymnastics experience, a basketball experience & a day trip to Skern Lodge
- After-school clubs returned half-way through the Spring term. In the summer term 38 children attended one of the active sports clubs (cycling club, lacrosse and rounders).

Key Indicator 5

Opportunities for competitive sport have increased during the year;

- Opportunities for competition have been introduced into PE lessons.
- The whole school participated in National School Sports Week through sports days which included team and individual competitive events.
- As Covid restrictions reduced opportunities for competitive sport were reintroduced:
 - o Winners at the Barnstaple Primary School Football tournament and runners-up at the regional finals.
 - o Winners of the Barnstaple Olympic Legacy Athletics Festival.
 - Winners of the North Devon Cricket Festival

The school retains the Gold School Games Mark for outstanding commitment to the development of competition across school and into the community.
