It is our aim to use the language linked to the concept as much as possible throughout the week whilst talking and playing with your child so that their understanding and use of new vocabulary widens.


This week our concept in the nursery is: **Size and weight**

The concept language for **size and weight** is:

In the nursery this week we will be reading:

<i>Jack and the beanstalk</i>	<i>Titch</i>	<i>How much does a ladybird weigh?</i>	<i>Smartest giant in town</i>
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**This week in the nursery some of our provision will include:**

- Planting seeds
- Building towers
- Sandcastle competition
- Playdough snakes
- Weighing different objects

**Also, in the nursery this week:**

<b>Maths</b>	Compare, estimate and predict to solve real-world problems related to length, weight and capacity.
<b>Phonics</b>	The children will be focusing on the sound <b><i>b</i></b> , looking at words such as <b><i>ball, bus, bird, bear</i></b>

If you would like to support your child to develop their understanding and use of the above vocabulary, here are some suggestions for you to try:

- Compare size of cuddly toys
- Weighing different foods at the shops or at home
- Scavenger hunt – who can find the longest leaf, smallest stone, tallest tree?
